MEANWHILE here is a summary of our Winter and Spring meetings of the Willits Garden Club:

Prior to the December holiday social, we had decided as a club to begin the new year with a new meeting place, day and time! We now meet at the Willits Senior Center, second Tuesday of the month at 1:00 p.m.

January 14, 2020: Advertising the changes with notices in the local newspapers and posters around town, and setting up our Willits Garden Club banner at the Senior Center lobby, our January meeting brought a few extra guests and a new member as we enjoyed Emma Harrington from Spare Time Garden Supply demonstrate plant cloning and discuss non-toxic pest and disease control products, giving out samples. Emma will be happy to help you with your gardening projects if you ask for her at Spare Time.

February 10, Carol Cox and Wolfgang Ronnefelolt of Grateful Gleaners gave us some background for their organization, telling of gleaning in German postwar poverty and the belief that sharing is a people-to-people solution to both waste and shortage of fresh produce. The group is all volunteers who pick and distribute your extra produce, and they could use some more help. Will train. They work with various agencies including the Willits Food Bank to distribute our extra produce to those who can make us of it. In addition we discussed making a club contribution to renewing the Blue Star Marker at Cal Fire on Ridgewood Summit, and agreed to pay half that cost.

March 9: Ruthanne Volz of Willits Food Bank and Community Services gave us some of her time to discuss the relationship between our home gardens and the Food Bank. Any extra produce from our gardens is welcomed and useful to local folks in need through the Food Bank. They can be contacted directly at 707-459-3333. We also voted at that meeting to move forward with a scholarship for a graduating senior this year, but the virus has thrown that into question now.
